September 9, 2022 – September 12, 2022
Margin of sampling error: +/- 3.97 percentage points for total

DETAILS: 1,003 adults 18 and older interviewed September 9-12, 2022 using the AmeriSpeak® Panel, the probability-based panel of NORC at the University of Chicago. The interviews were conducted online and over telephone using landlines and cell phones.
